CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mr. Bencivenga, President. Donaldson and approved. (6-0). Mr. Antolini arrived at 6:35 p.m. Public Session resumed at 7:30 p.m. at which time Mr. Bencivenga, President, led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Rozakis, Superintendent of Schools, introduced our special guest this evening. Mrs. Theresa Santmann has been a generous benefactor to all of the students of Babylon Schools. Her contributions have enhanced curriculum and instruction and have greatly benefited the particular students whom we are recognizing this evening who have excelled in science research and the arts. The Board of Education recognized the 2014 Valedictorian and Salutatorian, the Board of Education Student Council Delegates, the recipients of the 2014 4th Annual Babylon Art Festival, the 2014 Covantage EcoTech Scholarship and LISEF winners. Student Delegates, Ronnie Pashen, Giovanna Domingo and Max O'Handley reported on events in the Art, Music, Theater and History Department. Senior High Student Council events include: Powder Puff was held on May 30th, a small committee of student council students put together a lovely teacher appreciation this past week and students have begun preparations to run for various elected official positions for the 2014-2015 school year. Interviews will be aired in front of the school in September, when voting will take place. The building principals reported on events in their respective buildings. Mr. DeJoseph reported that the varsity boys lacrosse team are Suffolk Class C champions and will be competing for the Long Island Class C championship at Hofstra. He also reported on other athletic events. Mr. Rozakis made a statement regarding the proposal to change the special education model in the elementary school K-2 and stated that no changes that the district would ever make would diminish the amount or quality of services that the district would be required to deliver to any students. Mr. D'Amico spoke about the comprehensive special education audit and recommendations from that report. He also addressed the integrated special education K-2 model and staffing recommendations.

LONG ISLAND SCHOOL NUTRITION DIRECTORS COOPERATIVE BID LONG ISLAND SCHOOL NUTRITION DIRECTORS COOPERATIVE BID: WHEREAS, it is the plan of a number of public school districts in Nassau/Suffolk Counties, New York, to bid jointly on selected Food Service Commodities, Food and Food Service Supplies for the 2014-2015 school year. WHEREAS, Babylon Union Free School District is desirous of participating with other districts in Nassau/Suffolk Counties in the joint bidding of the commodities mentioned above as authorized by General Municipal Law, Section 119-0, and WHEREAS, Babylon Union Free School District wishes to appoint a committee to assume the responsibility of drafting specification, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, reporting the results to the Boards of Education and making recommendations thereon; therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Babylon Union Free School District, hereby appoints Long Island School Nutrition Directors Association Cooperative Bid Committee to represent it in all matters related above, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Babylon Union Free School District's Board of Education authorized the above mentioned committee to represent it in all matters leading up to the entering into a contract for the purchase of the above mentioned commodities, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Babylon Union Free School District's Board of Education agrees to assume its equitable share of the costs of the cooperative bidding, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Babylon Union Free School District's Board of Education agrees 1) to abide by the majority decisions of the participating districts on quality standards; 2) that unless all bids are rejected, it will award contracts according to the recommendations of the committee; 3) that after award of contract(s) it will conduct all negotiations directly with the successful bidder(s).

NEW VARIABLE HOUR EMPLOYEES RESOLUTION NEW VARIABLE HOUR EMPLOYEES RESOLUTION: WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) added a new Section 4980H to the Internal Revenue Code requiring the Babylon School District to offer ACAcompliant health insurance coverage to its full-time employees, as that term is defined within the ACA and its implementing regulations, or pay a penalty tax; and WHEREAS, the final regulations under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act allow for a look-back measurement method to be used for new variable hour employees to determine whether an employee is a full-time employee for purposes of Section 4980H; and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District desires to establish a look-back initial measurement period, administrative period and stability period for its new variable hour employees; and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District provides a health plan and is a participating municipality under the New York State Health Insurance Program (NYSHIP and HIP); and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District's health plan year is a calendar year which runs from January to December; and NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the initial measurement period for new variable hour employees shall be a period of 12 months which shall begin on the first day of the first month following the employee's start date; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the administrative period for new variable hour employees shall be a one-month period to begin immediately at the end of the initial measurement period and which shall continue through the end of the first full calendar month beginning on or after the end of the initial measurement period; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the corresponding stability period for new variable hour employees shall be a period of 12 consecutive calendar months to begin immediately after the administrative period.

ONGOING EMPLOYEES RESOLUTION

ONGOING EMPLOYEES RESOLUTION: WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) added a new Section 4980H to the Internal Revenue Code requiring the Babylon School District to offer ACA-compliant health insurance coverage to its full-time employees, as that term is defined within the ACA and its implementing regulations, or pay a penalty tax; and WHEREAS, ongoing employees' full-time status for purposes of Section 4980H must be determined prior to the start of the health plan year in 2015; and WHEREAS, the final regulations under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act allow for a look-back measurement method to be used for ongoing employees to determine whether an employee is a full-time employee for purposes of Section 4980H; and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District desire to establish a look-back standard measurement period, administrative period and stability period for its ongoing employees; and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District provides a health plan and is a participating municipality under the New York State Health Insurance Program (NYSHIP and HIP); and WHEREAS, the Babylon School District's health plan vear is a calendar vear which runs from January 1 to December 31; and NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the standard measurement period for ongoing employees shall be a period of 12 months to be measured from December 1, 2013 to November 30, 2014; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the administrative period for ongoing employees shall be a one-month period to be measured from December 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014; and BE IT FURTHER **RESOLVED**, that the corresponding stability period for ongoing employees shall be a period of 12 months to begin immediately after the administrative period on January 1, 2015 and to continue until December 31, 2015.
