CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mrs. Donaldson, President. A motion to enter executive session for the purpose of discussing specific labor negotiations, the employment history of particular individuals and advice from counsel was made by L. Jurs, seconded by E. Altbacker and approved. (7-0) Public session resumed at 7:40 p.m. at which time Mrs. Donaldson, President, led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Minutes of the Regular Business Meeting of March 7, 2016 and Work/Study Meeting of March 21, 2016 were approved on motion by C. Dell'Erba and seconded T. Pané. (7-0)

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer's and Business Office Financial Reports and Extra Curricular Fund Report for February 2016 were approved on motion by D. Bencivenga and seconded by E. Altbacker. (7-0)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board of Education recognized Mrs. Theresa Santmann for her very generous gift of \$200,000.00. The Board also recognized music students who participated in SCMEA All County Festival, the Varsity Cheerleading Team for winning the inaugural Suffolk County Cheer Championship and earning a bid to the first ever NYS Cheer Championships in Syracuse. The team also earned an 8th place finish at the New York State Championships. Two wrestlers were recognized for winning the Suffolk County Division 2 Wrestling Championships and earning a bid to the New York State Wrestling Championships in Albany. Student delegates reported on senior high student council events. Senior high student council members will be facilitating an awareness night on April 21 for the junior high students from 6-9 pm. The annual Powder Puff game will be held on May 20th. There will be a movie projected on the new turf field on June 2nd. They also reported on highlights in the science, art, and world languages departments. They reported that Babylon Buddies had another successful year. Babylon Buddies hosted West Islip, Lindenhurst and East Islip student at our socials, dances and our annual talent show.

Mrs. Rozzi, Superintendent of Schools reported the following News and Updates around the District:

- Mrs. Rozzi congratulated all of our recognized students who were able to attend this evening's meeting and that we are proud to celebrate their many accomplishments.
- Last month the PTA hosted the Harlem Wizards. What an amazing unity builder for our school community. Mrs. Rozzi thanked all PTA members and the PTA leadership who organized this wonderful event. It was a terrific, fun-filled evening and special thanks to our amazing staff that turned out to help or even play in the game representing the Babylon team.
- The proposed Smart Schools Bond application has been posted on the district's website where the public has a 30-day opportunity to comment. Once the Board of Education has approved officially the plan, it can then be submitted to the State for final approval. To date, SCDNET and Mason Technologies have completed walk-throughs of all three buildings to determine wireless needs. Quotes have been submitted for projects which provide wireless coverage throughout the district with room to grow. The proposal includes hardware and equipment needed for the wireless project such as access points and switches. It is the goal to begin wireless work early this

Dr. Daly, Deputy Superintendent, presented the proposed 2016-2017 school budget.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- T. Pané, audit committee chair, reported that the last audit committee meeting was held on March 7th at which time the findings of the Comptrollers audit was discussed. The next meeting will be held on May 9th at 5:30 p.m. for a status report from our internal auditors followed by a pre-audit conference from our external auditors in anticipation of the June 30, 2016 independent audit. Tonight the Board is approving the June 30, 2015 federal single audit which is an audit of our federal funds by our external auditors. The report will be placed on the website.
- L. Jurs, finance committee chair, reported that a budget presentation will be held this evening. The finance committee meeting scheduled for April is cancelled and a meeting will be scheduled for late May/early June.
- D. Bencivenga, buildings and grounds committee chair, reported that the fields are being used. We strongly encourage no bikes and dogs on the field and we are working on border issues. Casework colors were picked and the work is scheduled to start in mid-June. A few items on the agenda for approval is the casework cabinetry and food service equipment.
- D. Montalto, technology committee chair, reported that the Smart Schools Bond Plan has been placed on the district's website and a public hearing will be held and the Board will approve the plan to be sent to the State for approval.
- C. Dell'Erba, curriculum committee chair, reported that the committee will be meeting on April 27th at 3:30 p.m. to continue work on the mini grant program.
- E. Altbacker, policy committee chair, reported that the committee will be meeting in June.
- Committee meetings will be posted to the District website.
